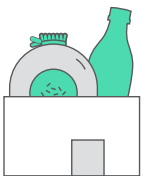


According to WFP's July 2018 Jordan Country Brief, **487,727 Syrian refugees** were assisted through cash-based transfers

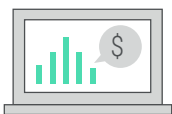


7,125 vulnerable Jordanians and Syrian refugees were assisted through livelihood support.

3iS services for Syria



Through its General Food Assistance (GFA) activity, the World Food Programme (WFP) provides monthly unconditional cash assistance to Syrian refugees in host communities and camps, with the objective to meet basic food needs of the most vulnerable.



WFP looks to collect data, findings and input from thousands of households with the support of 3iS to assist with their Food Security Outcome Monitoring project. Funded by the WFP, this collaborative effort commenced in July 2018 and remains an ongoing project.

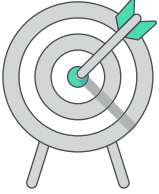

Objectives



The project is aimed at collecting, compiling and analyzing data from targeted and non-targeted WFP beneficiaries.

3iS works as a data management and analysis partner in these assessments targeting households that have received assistance from WFP.

3iS also provides advice and expertise on sound data collection and management practices, implemented the assessment as professionally as possible, and assisted WFP with the dataset as requested. The field sites are situated in a combination of locations where a high proportion of WFP beneficiaries reside.

3iS collects data and findings from households in four strata: extremely vulnerable refugees in communities; vulnerable refugees in communities; camp refugees; and non-beneficiaries.
