Improving Coordination, Analysis and Needs Assessment Capacities In Crisis-Affected Areas of Mali



Context

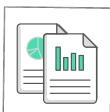


Mali is facing a multi-dimensional crisis for a decade which is creating continuous emergencies with increased humanitarian needs. The lack of basic services in various areas combined with the rise of "Islamic radical" movements, military operations, the gradual failure of the Algiers Agreements, several putsches (2012, 2020 and 2021) and extreme natural conditions due to climate change, have all exacerbated the poor living conditions of the affected population, especially in the northern and central parts of the country.

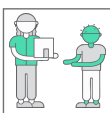


According to the 2022 Humanitarian Needs Overview, of the 12.9 million people affected by the crisis, approximately 7.5 million require some form of humanitarian assistance, a major increase compared to 2021 where 5.9 million individuals were affected by the ongoing crisis. The vulnerable groups identified include internally displaced persons (IDPs), host communities and refugees with women and children representing the overwhelming majority.

3iS Mali



Since 2018, as a part of its SBP, 3iSolution has been deploying IM officers to support clusters (Health, Shelter) and OCHA. Through the funding received from ECHO in 2022, 3iS is opening an office with a project that aims to improve the understanding of humanitarian needs while supporting the monitoring and coordination of the humanitarian response by regularly producing information management products.



More specifically, the project will deploy targeted personnel to key IM positions under OCHA's responsibility to improve data and information collection, cleaning and analysis in the regions of Gao, Mopti and Tombouctou. Additionally, the project will produce humanitarian situation reports through secondary data review (SDR) on crisis-affected areas or to different clusters depending on communicated needs. These reports will participate in the overall monitoring of the humanitarian situation and needs which will come into full interoperability with partners initiatives and assessments.

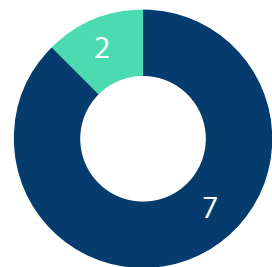
