





Factsheet 2 of 4 **Access to Services**

Disability is defined as interactions between personal and environmental factors. It is measured by the level of functioning of a person in various areas of daily activities (called "domains") regardless of impairments, using the Washington Group tools.


ACCESSIBILITY OF SHELTER AND LATRINE

Percentage of households reporting their latrine are **NOT** accessible





SPECIALIZED SERVICES

Of 1,903 persons with disabilities, 25.5% in Jordan and 57.5% in Lebanon require specialized services but cannot access them.
