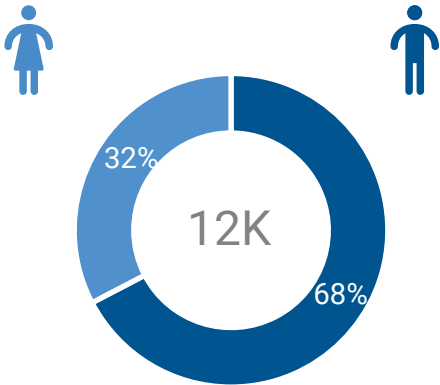


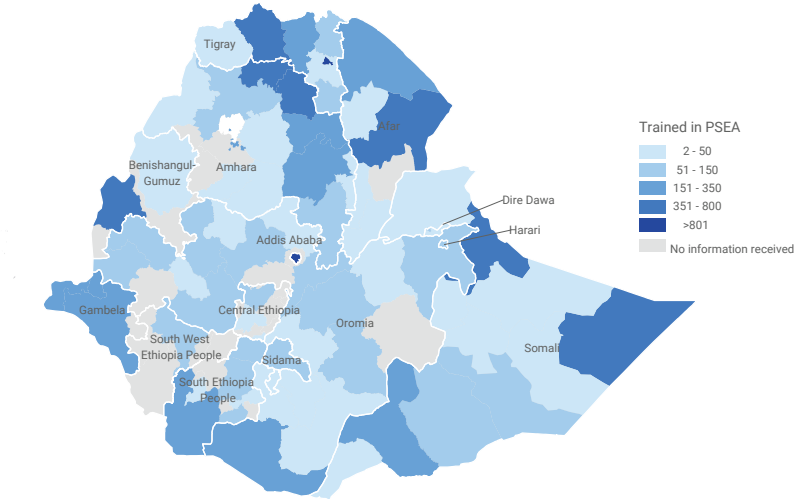
AN OVERVIEW

Protection against sexual exploitation and abuse ('PSEA'), also known as safeguarding, is a core commitment by humanitarian and development partners. In Ethiopia, a PSEA Network was established in 2018 and its membership includes 21 UN agencies, 46 international NGOs and 78 local NGOs. This snapshot is based on the Interagency Standing Committee (IASC) global indicators on PSEA, which are aimed to track the progress of PSEA interventions across countries. A Kobo tool was developed and shared with all Ethiopia PSEA Network members and inputs were received from 65 partners for activities implemented in 2024. As this was the first time the Kobo tool was rolled out, there are some mistakes in the inputs, so the results displayed should be considered as indicative only.

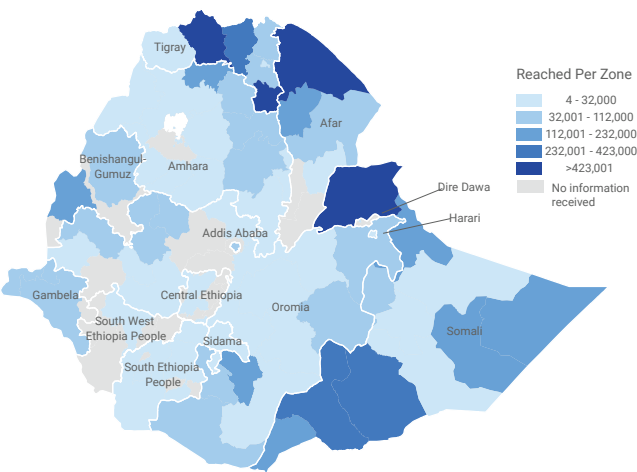
TOTAL NUMBER OF STAFF TRAINED IN PSEA DURING REPORTING PERIOD



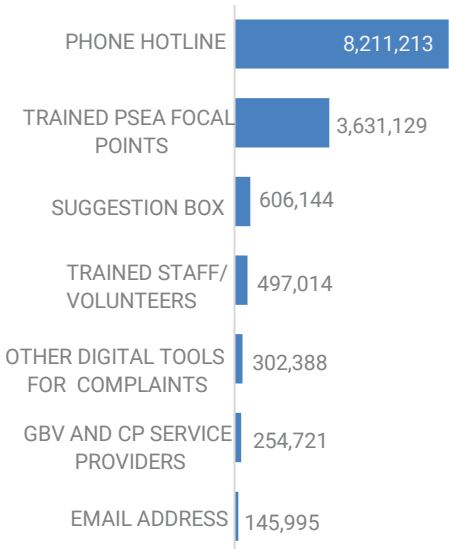
TOTAL NUMBER STAFF/PERSONNEL TRAINED IN PSEA



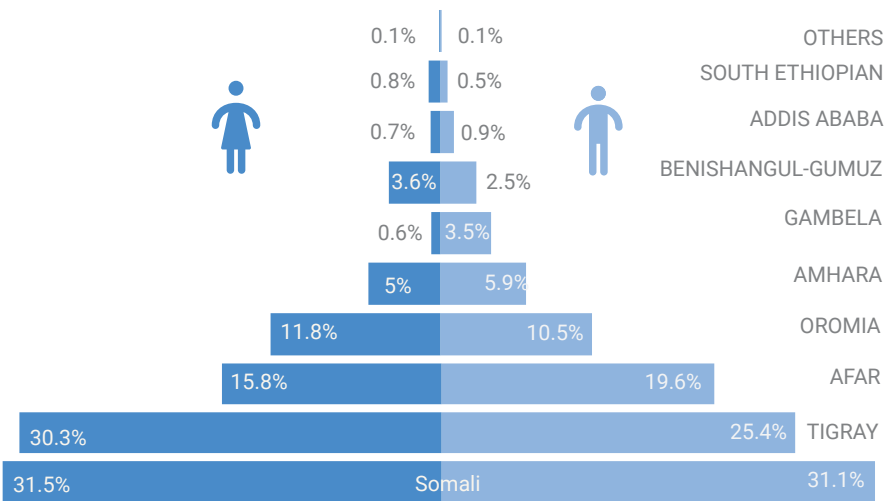
PSEA AWARENESS AT SITE LEVEL BY ZONE

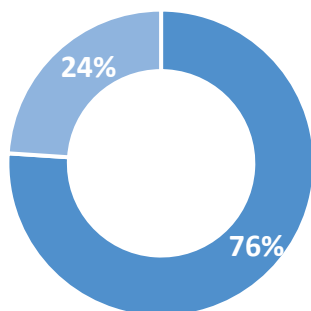

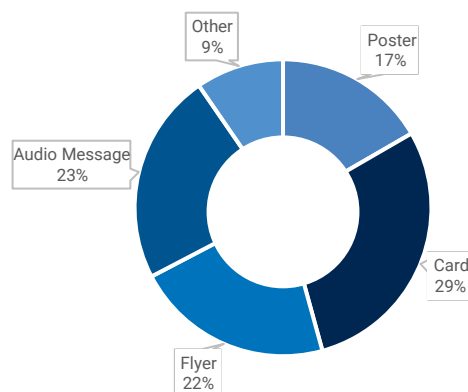
