## About Us

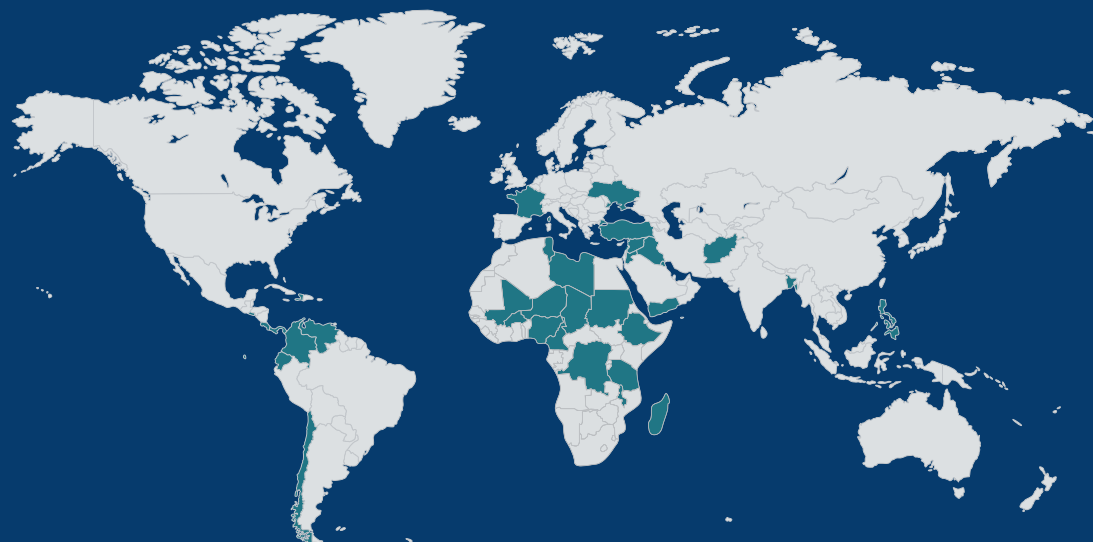
3iS was created in **2008** with a clear mission: to empower and enhance the understanding of information through innovative technology, transforming decision-making.

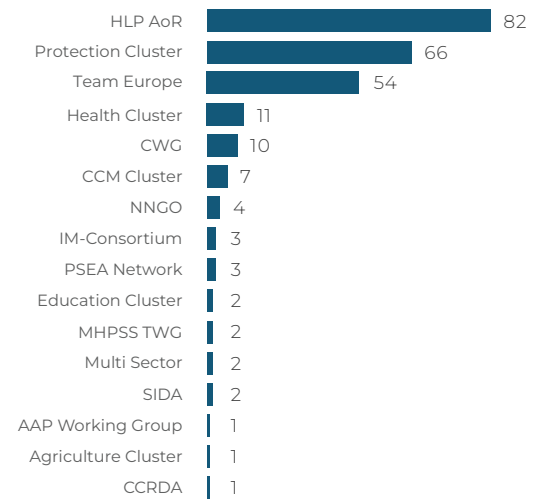
## Overview

Ethiopia is facing a complex crisis marked by conflict, displacement, food insecurity, malnutrition, and recurring climate-related disasters. Since 2021, 3iS has been supporting the response through coordination, information management, capacity building, and innovative tools across projects funded by DG ECHO, the DRC (HINGO), and the H2H Network. 3iS plays a key role in Ethiopia's humanitarian response as **Co-Chair of the AIMWG** and close partner to OCHA. It has formalized collaboration with CCRDA, a national network of over 460 NGOs and CSOs. As **lead of the EVIACT Consortium**, 3iS strengthens coordination, data management and capacity building by supporting information management, and digital platforms.

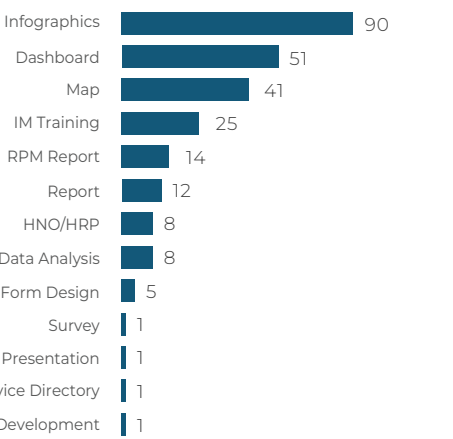
## Humanitarian Information Support (Service desk / IM Products)

## 3iS support to the Area Based Approach (ABA) in Tigray

In North-West Tigray, the Area-based approach facilitated by IOM is supported by 3iS through information management, technical advice, and capacity building to strengthen coordination, data systems, and evidence-based response. A harmonized Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) framework was developed to align partner reporting and outcome tracking, while a unified Complaint and Feedback Mechanism (CFM) enhances accountability, streamlines referrals, and ensures community voices inform response actions.

## 3iS support ET-RRM

3iS will support the ET-RRM, led by IRC through the RRM, by producing information management (IM) analytical products to enhance visibility, accountability, and strategic management in delivering timely lifesaving assistance to rapid-onset emergencies in Ethiopia.

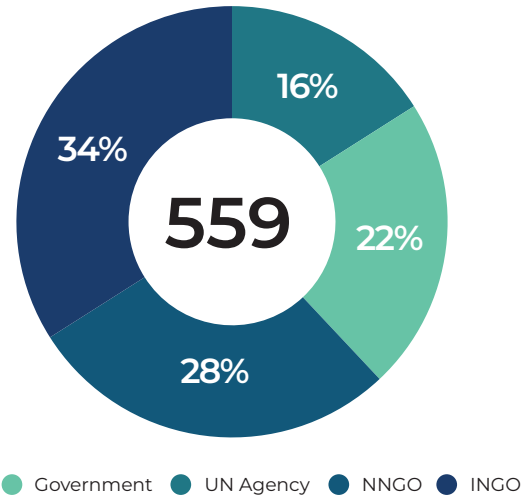

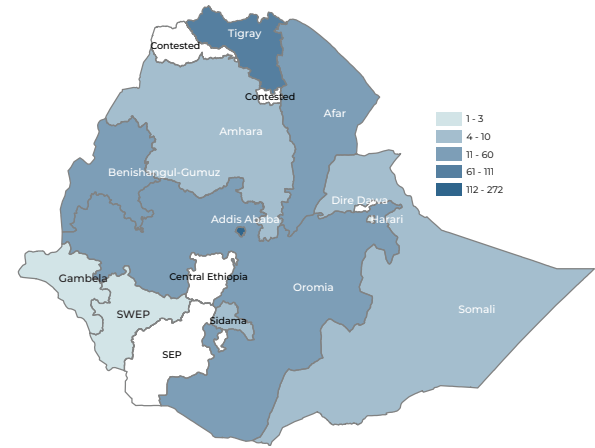

As part of our ongoing support to **IOM Programme** “Sustainable support to persons displaced by conflict and natural disasters and their host communities in Afar, Amhara, Benishangul-Gumuz, and Tigray” we conducted a series of capacity-building trainings for government stakeholders and DTM data collectors. Participants included regional and zonal Disaster Risk Management officers, Social Affairs experts, and field teams directly involved in displacement data collection.

The first wave of trainings has now been completed in **Tigray, Afar, and Benishangul-Gumuz**, with **Amhara** scheduled next. Across these sessions, **120 experts** were trained. This initiative is strengthening the quality, consistency, and reliability of displacement data, ultimately enabling more accurate analysis, better reporting, and improved humanitarian response planning for affected communities.
