

## Overview

### Problem Statement

In Nigeria, the humanitarian information management landscape faces significant challenges with worsening funding constraints. Only 16% of required funds for the Humanitarian Needs and Response Plan (HNRP) were received as of August 2025 according to the Financial Tracking Service (FTS), with coordination and support services only representing 2% of the allocated funds. This shortfall directly impacts information management capacity, reducing resources for data collection, analysis, and dissemination. Despite these constraints, coordination structures remain functional, with mechanisms such as NIF supporting humanitarian work in the Northwest.

### Our Approach

In coordination with the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC), 3iS assesses the IM capacities of the Nigerian Red Cross Society (NRCS), the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), and the State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) to address needs and gaps through a comprehensive capacity-building program focused on data management, including data collection, analysis, visualisations and the use of innovative tools. Training (including face-to-face and online) will be complemented with regular mentoring and virtual coaching to support personnel in practice. Enhanced data management and analysis capacity will improve the ability to make evidence-based, informed decision-making providing stronger IM coordination and mapping support in the North West.
